

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

New Beginnings.....

Our Holocaust Remembrance Day held at St. Timothy's Church was a huge success. I looked out at a standing room only audience, and was so glad that we've reached our goal of communicating the message of the Holocaust to those of different backgrounds. Having school children submit essays and artwork regarding the Holocaust was another part of the memorial service.

Many years ago, I went with 2 others to Bushnell to meet with the Superintendent of Sumter County schools. Our mission was to bring the study of the Holocaust into their school system. Superintendent Shirley was very cooperative as we brought him and some of his teaching staff to our Temple to watch the film "Paper Clips". This film depicted a small southeastern town in Tennessee, called Whitwell, where in 1996, an 8th grade project was begun to study other cultures, and teach them about tolerance. They started a Holocaust education program, and the students were overwhelmed at the massive scale of those murdered. But how to make them grasp what the number 6 million is?

Norwegians were paper clips on their lapels during World War II, as a silent protest against Nazi occupation. To better understand a figure of 6 million, the students sought to collect 6 million paper clips, and house them in an authentic German transport rail car, that was delivered in 2001. It gained worldwide attention, and at last count, over 30 million paper clips have been received.

Sharing Yom HaShoah with the entire community has proven to be a meaningful tradition. We continue to work for friendship and understanding with all of our religious counterparts.

Our mission was so successful, that Superintendent Shirley participated in our next Holocaust Remembrance Day.

FINANCE CORNER

Restricted Accounts

Most funds donated to Temple Shalom are placed in our general fund and are of great importance in ensuring the proper support of the Temple. They typically go to the operating budget; covering the mortgage, employees, utilities and services.

However, Temple Shalom, like most non-profit institutions also permits donations in the form of Restricted Accounts. Our Treasurer would generally set up a restricted account when requested and approved by the Board.

A restricted account confines the expenditures from these designated accounts for a particular purpose or special project; e.g. scholarship fund, landscaping, mortgage, choir, Rabbi discretionary fund, infrastructure, books, targeted maintenance, etc. Once the account is established, any donor may designate any restricted fund as the recipient of their donation.

Lastly, some donors, especially ones interested in leaving a legacy gift, do want to restrict their contributions to a particular purpose, especially big projects or infrastructure of some kind in their name.

ED-JEW-CATION: SUPERMEN



On Fathers' Day we honor all you men, Papas and Zaydees (Dads and Granddads), who have had so much influence on their families and communities. It is also a good time to recognize those Jewish super men, most all of them fathers and grandfathers,

who have influenced the whole world they lived in. Jewish men, particularly, have an inordinately long and colorful history of being some of the greatest thinkers and doers of all time. Although you may not agree about their order of importance, you will acknowledge the men listed below as those who shook our universe.

David Ben Gurion (1886-1973, 3 children) is credited with his instrumental role in the founding of the state of Israel. After leading Israel to victory in the '48 Arab-Israeli War, Ben-Gurion helped build state institutions and encouraged the absorption of the Jews who flocked there from all over the world. Posthumously, Ben-Gurion was named one of Time Magazine's 100 Most Important People of the Century.

Niels Bohr (1885-1962, 6 children) was a Danish physicist who made fundamental contributions to understanding atomic structure and quantum mechanics. He received the Nobel Prize in Physics in 1922. He was part of the team of physicists who worked on the Manhattan Project. One of his sons, Aage Niels Bohr, was a physicist like his father, who also received the Nobel Prize, in 1975. Bohr has been described as one of the most influential physicists of the 20th century.

Gustav Mahler (1860-1911, 2 children) Mahler was a composer and conductor, born in Bohemia but considered an Austrian. He was best known during his own lifetime as one of the leading orchestral and operatic conductors of the day. Now he is acknowledged as among the most important late romantic composers, primarily of symphonies and song. Classical musicians say

he "blurred the lines "between orchestral song, symphony, and symphonic poem, opening up new forms of musical composition.

Baruch de Spinoza (1632-1677, no children) Baruch de Spinoza was a Dutch philosopher of Portuguese Jewish origin. Although his work was not fully realized until years after his death, today he is considered the greatest rationalist of 17th century philosophy. Because of his controversial views on the Hebrew Bible and the nature of the Divine, he was expelled by the Jewish society as a heretic and atheist when he was 23 years old. He earned his living as a lens grinder, and consequently glass dust was the contributing factor to his early death. He laid the groundwork for the Enlightenment and modern biblical criticism and is considered to be one of western philosophy's most important philosophers. Some called him "The Prince of Philosophy". His body of work, "Ethics", was a treatise on God and Nature and is deemed one of the most important philosophical books ever written.

Sigmund Freud (1856-1939, 6 children) Sigmund Shlomo Freud founded the psychoanalytic school of psychology. He is best known for his theories of the unconscious mind and the defense mechanism of repression. He is also credited with creating the clinical practice of psychoanalysis for curing psychopathology through dialogue between a patient and a psychoanalyst. He is renowned for his redefinition of sexual desire as the primary motivational energy of human life. (What do you guys think about that idea? Agree?)

Maimonides (1135-1204, 1 child) Moses
Maimonides is also known as the Rambam, as he was a rabbi, physician, and philosopher while living in Spain, Morocco and Egypt during the Middle Ages. This Jewish philosopher influenced both the Jewish and non-Jewish world. Although his many works on Jewish law and ethics were met with opposition during his lifetime, he was posthumously acknowledged to be one of the foremost rabbinical arbiters and philosophers in Jewish history. His works are still being studied.

Albert Einstein (1879-1955, 5 children) Einstein, a theoretical physicist, is best known for his theory of relativity, specifically the famous massenergy equation, E=mc2. He received the Nobel Prize in 1921, for his service to theoretical physics and for his discovery of the law of the photoelectric effect. Einstein published over 300 scientific works and over 150 non-scientific works. In 1999, Time magazine named him "Person of the Century". The name "Einstein" is synonymous with genius.

Abraham (2000BC to 1825 BC, 12 children?) Abraham has the distinction of being perceived as the founding religious patriarch by Jews, Christians, and Muslims. Abraham means "High Father". According to Genesis, Abraham was brought by God from Mesopotamia to Canaan where he entered into a covenant, in exchange for sole recognition of God as supreme universal deity and authority.

Moses (393 BC-1273 BC, 2 children) Moses, the most important prophet in Judaism was also a military leader, religious leader, lawgiver, and writer of the Torah. After leading the Hebrews from slavery, while wandering the desert with them for 40 years, the Bible tells that Moses received the Ten Commandments from God and gave them to the Hebrews and subsequently to the world.

And the #1 Jewish Super Man is Jesus (7-2 BC – 26-36 AD?, no known children) Jesus of Nazareth, is considered the founding figure of Christianity, the religion that shaped Europe and much of the world. Most scholars of religious history believe that ancient texts on Jesus' life are at least partially accurate. They agree that Jesus was a Galilean Jew who was regarded as a teacher and healer. They also accept that he was baptized by John and crucified in Jerusalem on orders of the Roman Prefect of Judaea Pontius Pilate on the charge of sedition against the Roman Empire.

And there you have 'em! This list was compiled by people whose work it is to compile lists, and does not reflect the views of the editor of this publication or its staff! 



RITUALLY SPEAKING

The month of April brought a new experience to the Ritual Committee. The committee members under the direction of Rabbi Zev "koshered" our kitchen for Passover. Some of our members have done this in their own homes as I have and as I had seen this done growing up in my family home. Some had heard about this practice and for the first time saw it done.

What did we do you may ask, well let me tell you what it entailed. We cleaned the kitchen sink with boiling water and cleaned all the surfaces throughout the kitchen and removed all traces of bread and non-Passover foods in the first refrigerator. We were able to designate this one refrigerator as kosher for Passover by cleaning the shelves and keeping it strictly for Passover foods to be used for the Seder. We then submerged all of utensils that would be used for preparation of foods into boiling water to cleanse them for Passover. Once all the cleaning was completed we wrapped the cleansed items together so that they would not be used for other purposes. Rabbi Zev personally covered all the kitchen counter surfaces with plastic sheeting to keep them ready for Passover.

Everyone enjoyed this experience as we shared the custom of Passover preparation.

Shavuot begins this year on Saturday evening, June 8, which commemorates the receiving of the Ten Commandments. Traditionally the evening is spent studying. This year at 7:00 pm Rabbi Zev will be leading a study session on the Book of Ruth, which is read on Shavuot, and other Biblical topics. We will have dairy desserts and dairy kugels prepared by our own Temple members. Please indicate by e-mail to Larry Wallace by June 5th at LynLarWall@aol.com if vou plan on attending and whether or not vou plan on bringing a dairy treat to share.

On a personal note, this will be the final Ritually Speaking article from me, Sherry Elias. My husband Paul and I are moving back to South Florida. 
